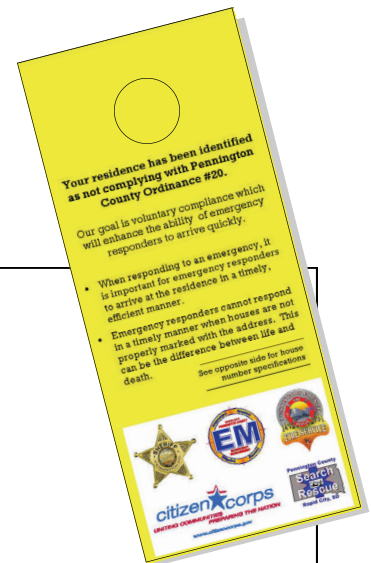


You may have received a notice at your residence that looks something like this... containing the following information....



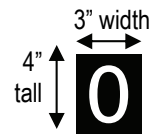
Your residence has been identified as not complying with Pennington County Ordinance #20.

Our goal is voluntary compliance which will enhance the ability of emergency responders to arrive quickly.

- When responding to an emergency, it is important for emergency responders to arrive at the residence in a timely, efficient manner.
- Emergency responders cannot respond in a timely manner when houses are not properly marked with the address. This can be the difference between life and death.

To bring your residence into compliance with the ordinance, the following corrective action is required to be completed within 30 days:

1. **House numbers/Lot numbers must be posted.**
 - Numbers need to be a minimum of 4 inches in height and 3 inches in width
 - numbers must be a contrasting color to the background.
2. If length of driveway or **physical obstruction** prevent the house number from being seen from the road, the **house number must be posted adjacent to the driveway** where it intersects the road.
3. If the above condition is applicable, but the driveway serves **multiple houses, each house number must be listed on the sign.** In addition each house must be marked.



- Your residence will be visited at a future date to see if you have brought it into compliance.
- If residence is not in compliance at this time, further action may be taken.
